Who Should File This Form

NYU will provide admitted Early Decision applicants with an *estimated* financial aid award. All Early Decision applicants are automatically considered for merit aid **without** filing this application. *However*, if your family does not believe it can pay the cost of an NYU education from personal funds, you should file this form. Filing this form may entitle you to receive aid in addition to any NYU merit scholarships you may receive. (Such aid may include additional scholarships, work, and loans.) **If you do not file this Early Decision Program Financial Aid Application, you will not be considered for additional NYU need-based aid, even if you file the FAFSA after January 1.**

Filing Instructions

Please answer all questions beginning with Section A below. Use zeros if the answer is 0 or N/A if not applicable but *do not leave blanks*. When you submit the form, you must also attach your parents' individual federal 2006 tax returns. If your parents are separated, include the information for the parent with whom you reside. If your parents are divorced, then include the information for the parent with whom you reside and, if remarried, that parent's spouse's income information. Please review the "Early Decision Financial Aid Application Checklist" at the end of the application to ensure completion of the process. It is important that you fill in the information completely and thoroughly as described to avoid a delay in the processing of your application. Delays may ultimately affect your financial aid eligibility. Incomplete applications cannot be processed. The deadline for filing this form is November 1, 2007. Note that you must confirm your Early Decision Program estimated award by filing a 2008-2009 Free Application for Financial Aid (FAFSA) after January 1, 2008, and no later than February 15, 2008.
